7.2 Economic Development update

Geraldine Christou

Zambrero (Blood Bank Building)

Lease has finally been signed! Opening will occur on Tuesday 16th August and fit out has already commenced. The health food business is still looking to commence in the More than Just Cupcakes former building. Meeting held with another food chain last week and investor has communicated he will invest in Fryers Street in 12-24 months.

Environmental Upgrade Agreements

Council is currently working with the Sustainable Melbourne Fund to offer within Greater Shepparton Environmental Upgrade Agreements. The Local Government Act was amended to allow for EUA's to be entered through Council. EUA's offer landlords the opportunity to enter into loan agreements with the SMF while Council receives repayments through its rates system. EUA's offer landlords the opportunity to include the tenant into the agreement and receive competitive interest rates and extended loans which can make energy related initiatives more viable. Council, at the April Council Meeting, resolved to adopt this system, internal processes are currently being undertaken with the ability to enter into the agreements being available in approximately 4-6 weeks. Contracts have been signed and a number of landlords and tenants have already signed up which is fantastic.

GV Link

Currently in negotiation with three investors interested in commencing operations at the GV Link site.

Commercial in Confidence Investment Discussions

A number of large investment discussions are progressing with announcements regarding job numbers to occur in the coming months.

Council is also working with Geoffrey Thompson in relation to their plans for the SPC Mooroopna site.

Inland Rail Forum

Held 30 June 2016, with great attendance. Council and attendees have determined an action plan to progress this game changing project in our favour including engaging the new Port of Melbourne owner and lobbying the Federal Government to ensure that the terms of reference for EOI's for private investors is broad enough to enable all route options to be considered.

Mini Minor Event

Continuing to work with Goulburn River Valley Tourism to develop a mini minors event which will be four days across the four regions of GRVT - Greater Shepparton, Strathbogie, Mitchell and Murrindindi - 250kms in each of the regions, aiming to attract

1,000 mini minors to participate. Draft itineraries for each of regions are currently being developed. Branding

Goulburn River Valley Tourism launched their new destinational branding at the Annual Dinner held on 30 June and also their new website www.heartofvictoria.com.au.

8.1 Marketing Planning

8.2 Parking sign

Peter Radevski

- Peter mentions he was in the CBD on a Saturday morning and was confused by the parking sign. It had parking times from; Monday – Friday 9am - 5:30pm and Saturday 9am - 12pm. Peter says parking is free on Saturday's, so why is the sign incorrect?
- Shane adds that often confused people enter his stores asking whether they have to pay or not
- Geraldine says the parking is free on Saturday so why aren't we promoting it
- Shane mentions the parking officers are out on a Saturday
- Geraldine adds parking time limits still apply
- Shane says they mostly monitor the loading zones and disabled parking
- Fiona suggests that her or Mat can pass this onto the relevant person at Council

8.3 'Spin Out' movie

Peter Radevski

- Peter asks if there is going to be an opening for the 'Spin Out' movie that was filmed locally
- Geraldine says yes, that has only been confirmed this month. The premiere will be in Shepparton. The Community Fund is working in with Sony to orchestrate the event. Economic Development department are doing our best to work in with it also in terms of activating the CBD

8.4 Maude St Mall discussion

Ron Popelier

- Ron mentions the Chamber are in support of re-opening the Mall and suggests the SSM Committee align with them or support them
- Geraldine says there's no reason why we can't
- Fiona says if the committee want to determine a position on this matter they can
- Fiona adds is it the partial or full reopening of the Mall
- Malcolm says to clarify the partial reopening is one way traffic through Stewart Street to come out at Corio Street
- Malcolm suggests the committee vote on which they would like to support (partial or full reopening)
- Sam says before he votes on this he'd like to know the costings of both
- Geraldine agrees. We need to know the cost for the return on investment

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- Ron adds the cost for the partial reopening is \$4.2M, as far as he knows there isn't any figures for the full reopening
- Geraldine says the figures were provided by Council
- Shane thinks instead of voting to keep it simple by saying, we support the Chamber of a partial reopening of the Maude Street Mall
- Simon thinks there are too many obstacles in the Mall eg: Trees
- Ron disagrees, trees offer good canopy. The Mall is entirely concrete and is not inviting
- Geraldine asks what the consensus is, are we in support?
- Sam adds that he is in full support of reopening the Mall, although if there are two different options to vote on, he needs to know the figures before voting on either
- Geraldine says we can put in a request to Council to provide costings on the full reopening
- Fiona adds the SSM committee support the reopening in principle although costings on both options need to be requested then provided before a definitive decision can be made
- Peter asks Ron if the Chamber have put this request to Council
- Ron responds that the Chamber plan to present this to Council
- Malcolm suggests we write a letter stating the SSM committee support the Chamber in their action to reopen the Mall

Action: Laura to draft a letter to the Shepparton Chamber of Commerce stating the Shepparton Show Me Committee is in support of their action to reopen the Mall. Letter to be sent to Fiona and Malcolm for approval.
